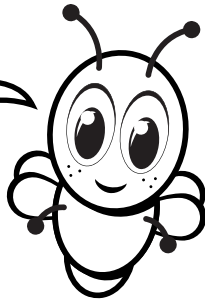


Blinky's Family Challenge
